• NEW! CSM Jobs Landing Page Live on the CCON website CSM has developed a 'CCON landing page,' a webpage located on the CCON website, where CCON students can submit their interest to the Human Resources (HR) department at CSM, prior to applying for a job. The landing page asks for simple information, such as contact information, areas of interest, year in school, etc., and should take about two minutes to complete. The purpose of the landing page is to ease the application process for students, while also improving coordination of the interviewing and hiring process, and enhancing communication between students and CSM HR.

Please note the landing page submissions do not take the place of the actual CSM online application. Students will still need to complete an application for any specific jobs they are interested in, however this process will assist the students through the application process by connecting them with hiring managers for specific openings earlier. It may also be used to guide the students to apply for the actual job(s) that may be appropriate for their areas of interest.

Why do we have Constitution Day?

Senator Robert C. Byrd, (WV-D) believed that American primary, secondary, and post-secondary students lacked meaningful knowledge about the U.S. Constitution. In December 2004, he offered an amendment which passed both the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate in an effort to increase students' knowledge of this important historical document.

As a result, the U.S. Department of Education requires all institutions receiving federal funds provide an educational program pertaining to the U.S. Constitution on September 17 of each year to commemorate the signing of the U.S. Constitution on September 17, 1787.

On Friday, September 16th please wear **RED**, WHITE, & **BLUE** to celebrate the birthday of the United States Government.
